Objective:
This challenge will demonstrate your understanding of how to target IDs and classes in CSS.

Action:
In the HTML file provided there are several paragraphs. One has an ID and the other paragraphs have classes. You will write CSS that targets those elements to apply the correct style.

- In the file **index.css** make the following changes:
 - Write CSS to make the element with the ID **main** have a background that is **yellow**
 - Write CSS to make any element with the class **blueText** have text that is **blue**
 - Write CSS to make any element with the class **redText** have text that is **red**

NOTE:

- Access **index.css** in the CSS tab
- Do not make changes to the HTML on the page
- Do not create any new elements on the page
- When applying color in your CSS, use the exact values provided
- Do not use CSS shorthand
- For each action item, write a single line of CSS that sets the correct property and value
